**Treasurer's report on YEAR END ACCOUNTS – 2019-2020** Treasurer pleased to report that our accounts have been audited successfully. Many thanks to Gaye Templeton for her work on this. We will be making a donation to Junction 42 as a thank you for the audit work.

At the yearend, 31 March 2020 there was £1,888.22 in the bank account of Ponteland Community Partnership. This is split into Restricted Funds £572.50 and General Funds £1,315.72. Due to Covid19 there is some expenditure which will be accounted for in the financial year 2020-21 related to website updating, anti graffiti protection to the pedestals on the Bridleway and meeting room hire.

**Projects Arrangements** for the anti-graffiti treatment to 4 pedestals along the bridleway has been delayed again due to lack of access to the Callerton Lane pedestal and by Covid19. Many of the young people supporting our Youth Projects are finding things very difficult at the moment, with this in mind; it has been decided to re-launch the Youth Projects in the autumn 2020 - This should give us all time to adjust. Over the next couple of months, when the Bridleway is reopened, we plan to re-launch the health benefits of the Bridleway. The promotional leaflets have been reprinted, by donation, distributed at a later date.
